- Esri donates software for K-12 use
- AAG trains/connects GIS professionals with schools
- Collaboration maximizes benefit and efficiency of program





### Who can be a GeoMentor?


- Members of GIS community who are able to share their skills and experiences through volunteering

- 1651 GeoMentors
- 35 in Maryland




### What does a GeoMentor do?

- Advocates for GIS classroom integration and assisting to set up their free ArcGIS Online accounts
- Connect educators with available GIS classroom exercises
- Share information about careers in Geography or GIS
- Get students excited about GIS



### How to become a GeoMentor

- Register online (<u>www.geomentors.net</u>)
- Being a GeoMentor does not need to be time consuming/labor intensive
- Any and all involvement is beneficial
- Range of Activities
  - Reaching out to schools/sending info
  - Mentor a student on projects
  - Speak at school's/events
  - Offer technical support
  - GIS Day



# I signed up, now what?

### Reach out to schools

- Go through current connections (child's school, teachers you may know)
- Utilize GeoMentor web tool

### **Email with educators**

- Introduce to GeoMentor resource site
- Walk them through installing ArcGIS (if needed)

### Promoting is very important to GeoMentoring

- Tweet your experience
- Document as a case study

### Promoting works for you too

- AAG Newsletter / Spotlights
- Certificate (and a free GIS Innovator pin!)
