Directions:

Directions from the east (metro areas): take I-70 to the US-40 Hagerstown exit. Proceed to the center of the city (3½ miles) and turn left at North Potomac Street (one-way towards the south). Go 2 blocks, Library is on the left.

Directions from the west: Take I-70 to I-81 north. Exit at US-40 towards Hagerstown. Proceed to the center of the city (1.7 miles) and turn right on South Potomac South Street. Go 1 block, Library is on the left.

Warning: most of the downtown street are one-way, with the exceptions of Antietam Street and Baltimore Street.

Parking Options:

- There is a lot behind the library off East Antietam Street. You must take a ticket to enter, with pay stations inside the building.
- There is a fee parking deck a half a block away in the alley east of and parallel to the unit block of South Potomac Street, accessible from East Washington Street.
- There is another fee parking deck 1½ blocks away on the west side of the unit block of North Potomac Street.
- There is a metered lot in the alley east of and parallel to the unit block of North Potomac Street, with long time limits.
- There is some metered street parking in the neighborhood, but may have a 2 hour limit.

Lunch Options:

There are many lunch options within a block or two, including full service restaurants, lunch only, pizza, Thai and delis. Fast food and other restaurants are in driving distance (4-5 blocks+) to the east and west on US-40.

Meeting Location:

The meeting will be on the 3rd (top) level of the Library, in the Community Meeting Room (308-309).
