Administrative

Membership in the Maryland Nonprofit Organization Julie attended a board breakfast with the Maryland Nonprofit Organization (MNO) last Friday, 10/4. They host events regularly and MSGIC board members can attend. Julie is going to share information about their upcoming events with the group.



Julie has downloaded some resources from the MNO related to succession planning, board responsibilities, recording votes, meeting notes, etc. These will be made available on Google Drive. Julie recommended revisiting the MSGIC strategic plan that Pat McLoughlin started. MSGIC's bylaws need to be revisited. We may want to review the template provided by the MNO and use it as a starting point instead of revising the existing bylaws.

Julie is going to engage legal services to initiate the change of MSGIC from a 501c3 private foundation to 501c3 public charity.

The MSGIC Executive Committee is actually a board. However, we don't have an executive director. If we get an executive director, we'll have to determine if they will be paid or unpaid. The National Alliance for Public Safety GIS (NAPSG) Foundation pays someone to be the executive director. The sole purpose of the company they use is to provide executive directors for boards.

Lauren was unable to attend this meeting.

Julie sat in a meeting on Monday, 10/7 on the Rural Edge workshop. Esri is looking for 25 to 30 people to attend the in-person workshop which will take place at Salisbury University. There are 19 people signed up so far. Five seats are going to be made available to folks from Delaware through Esri. MSGIC is paying for lunch on one of the workshop days. There are still five open seats for people from Maryland.

Outreach Subcommittee – Patrick Callahan The MSGIC website is back up.

Private Caucus - Niki Miller

There are several consultants who are interested in presenting at the winter quarterly meeting around the topic of electric and gas utilities. Before committing, the consultants want to know where and when the winter quarterly meeting will be held. The meeting is usually held the third week of January in southern Maryland.

Julie met someone at the MNO who works at the College of Southern Maryland in La Plata. MSGIC has used this venue before, but it was expensive. The Metro Washington Council of Governments (MWCOG) developed walksheds for commuter rail, Metro, VRE, and streetcars. It's getting used by the community.

Charlene reported an issue that MWCOG is having where datasets cannot be downloaded from the Open Data site. This is a known issue with Esri.

There is an email from Worchester County that Julie is going to share with JB and Katy. They requested their question be shared with all MSGIC members, but Julie thinks it's probably better suited to the local caucus members.

5. Maryland's Geospatial Conference Advisory Meeting – Julie Spangler

There is a desire to limit attendance at the advisory committees to Towson, MSGIC, and DoIT. Tasks will be delegated to subcommittee members.

In the last meeting, the group discussed the 2019 conference survey results. There were 100 responses and there were a lot of opposing views about the organization of the two-day conference. The industry talks were highly rated and attendance numbers were up from last year. Julie will review the survey results with MSGIC members at the fall quarterly meeting.

The Student Union will be opening around the time of the 2020 conference. The conference will likely be in the Liberal Arts building again in 2020.

6. Other Topics

Executive Committee Meetings

We've had a couple of virtual executive committee meetings in the recent past. The group is open to a virtual meeting every other month or every three months. We are also open to having executive committee meetings in other locations. A suggestion was to have a meeting in Cambridge, Maryland or at a sponsor location.

Use of Google Suite for Nonprofits Matt Sokol was starting to investigate the use of the Google Suite for nonprofits. Now that he's gone, we'll need someone else to research this.
