- 35 of 48 people who signed up attended

Plan for TUGIS Training

- As discussed in last month's meeting, there will not be a day of training at the TUGIS Conference this year; MSGIC is going to host a TUGIS training series instead
- The plan is to hold at least one training per month starting in April and finishing in August

Membership & Invoicing Update – Shawn Pickett

Membership Year

- Jeremy Sheinker from the Maryland Department of Emergency Management (MDEM) reached out about the cost of creating a Tier 2 organization account
- Last October the EC implemented a new policy where anyone can sign up July-December and pay the full amount for a membership, which is good until the following July. People who sign up January-April pay a prorated amount for the remainder of the year plus the regular amount for the next year. People who sign up from May-end of June get that time for free. They are paying for the upcoming year and their invoice is not due until the following July.
- The new member sign up needs to be updated to explain the membership costs. It would also be nice to break out the costs on the invoice.
